The Ozark Piecemakers Quilt Guild was established in 1981 and has served the community of Springfield and the surrounding areas of 29 years. We continue to support: Bailey Alternative High School, Child Advocacy Center, Cox Hospital, Festival of Sharing, Harmony House, Ronald McDonald House, Southwest Center for Independent Living, St. John's Hospital, The Kitchen, and Burn-out- Victims, Fund Raisers, and other Miscellaneous recipients. Our Doll Quilt program makes small quilts to give to Crosslines, which are distributed to children at Christmas. We also provide educational programs on the art/history of quilting, art quilts, wearable arts and fiber arts for the Library Center and local schools by request.

The Guild designs and constructs a donation quilt each year. The chances on these quilts are purchased by the community. Part of the proceeds from this quilt will be used to establish:

To award a scholarship each year to a design-related major attending a college or university in the greater Ozark area. Students must meet all criteria guidelines.
