

Community Quilt Block

12 $\frac{1}{2}$ in by 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ in

Shadows

Med to Dark print: cut 4-6 strips of varying widths, long enough to cover a 13 1/2" piece of freezer paper on the diagonal. The first one should be about 18+" long, then decreasing in length. They have to be long enough to fold over and press and still be beyond the freezer paper.

Tan print: cut 13 1/2" square of fabric (this will make two).
Cut on the diagonal once.

Freezer paper or other paper to stitch fabric to;
Cut 13 1/2" square

Directions: Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " Seam allowance throughout construction.

Iron tan triangle fabric to a 13 1/2" square piece of freezer paper. Stitch first strip using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and press away from tan fabric. Continue to add and stitch strips, pressing after each strip is added. For the last piece cut a triangle with short sides on straight of grain, stitch on unit to finish square. Trim block to a 12-1/2" square by putting the 45% line of the ruler on the diagonal created by tan fabric and the first color strip. Tear off the paper. Turn in your block to the Community Quilt Table-at the next guild meeting.
